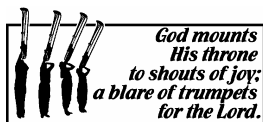

SEAM is having a raffle for (2) passes to the Ryder Cup event to be held here in Louisville in September. Raffle tickets are \$100.00/each—with a maximum of 250 tickets to be sold. Also, this is the report on the following areas: **Life Skills/Assistance Center:** In March we saw 147 families, 43 rec'd \$3,179 in SEAM's financial assistance, 30 families rec'd \$5,947 in Winter Help and 125 rec'd food. This means that 73 families rec'd \$9,126 in some type of financial assistance from SEAM in one month. **Food Room Needs:** Cereal; Canned Fruit; Canned Meats; and Rice. **Winterhelp update:** We rec'd a total of \$17,884 in Winter Help this year. This represents an increase over previous year and we helped approx. 170 families with their LG&E through this program this year. **Youth & Family Services:** The After School Tutoring & Mentoring Program will be ending for this school year on May 1st. We had a total of 18 students throughout the year, with 13 tutors having volunteered their time and talent. Reading seems to be the most difficulty that the students have since many are reading below their grade level by 1 to 3 levels. The summer program begins from June 3rd thru June 26th, on Tuesdays; Wednesdays; and Thursdays from 2-4pm. We will need 4 tutors. This will be a "Corrective Reading Program" concentrating on reading comprehension, vocabulary, and critical thinking components. **Cornhole Classic:** 1st Annual South East Associated Ministries "Cornhole Classic", June 21st at Midland Park Baptist Church, 6500 Six Mile Lane.
