**WORSHIP**

- 1-1 **ART & ENVIRONMENT** This group makes decorations for church through sewing, designing, etc.
- 1-2 **BEREAVEMENT (PRAYER SERVICE)** A group of persons who pray at the vigil service on the day before a funeral.
- 1-3 **BEREAVEMENT (RESURRECTION CHOIR)** This choir sings at funerals and other special liturgies throughout the year.
- 1-4 **BEREAVEMENT (LUNCHEONS)** Several groups of persons take turn preparing and serving lunches to families following a funeral.
- 1-5 **BEREAVEMENT (FOLLOW UP)** This committee's members follow up with phone calls, visits, etc.
- 1-6 **EUCHARISTIC ADORATION** The fourth Sunday of each month in church from 12:30-3:00pm.
- 1-7 **EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS** Serve communion during liturgies. Individuals are trained and commissioned.
- 1-8 **GARDENING CLUB** This club takes care of the grounds by weeding, watering, and planting flowers.
- 1-9 **GOD'S HOUSEKEEPERS** This group cleans church one Friday or Saturday every other month (6 times a year).
- 1-10 **HEALING PRAYER SERVICE** This committee plans and participates in healing prayer services held during the year.
- 1-11 **HOSPITALITY MINISTERS** This group welcomes people at each mass, takes up the collection, carries gifts to altar, etc.
- 1-12 **LECTORS** This ministry proclaims the Word at liturgies. Individuals are trained and commissioned.
- 1-13 **LITURGY PLANNING COMMITTEE** Meets to plan each liturgical season including theme, music, art & environment, and readings.
- 1-14 **MINISTRY TO THE SICK AND ELDERLY** Brings communion and serves the sick and elderly through visits to their homes, hospital, nursing home, etc.
- 1-15 **MUSIC (CANTORS)** Lead the church congregation in sung prayer during worship.
- 1-16 **MUSIC (CHOIR)** Responsible for music at Sunday 11:30 Liturgy and other special liturgies during the year.
- 1-17 **MUSIC (FOLK)** Responsible for music at Sunday 9:00 Liturgy and other special liturgies during the year.
- 1-18 **MUSIC (YOUTH)** Responsible for music at Sunday 11:30 Liturgy twice monthly and other events.
- 1-19 **SACRISTAN (WEEKDAY)** Responsible for overseeing preparation prior to weekday Liturgies.
- 1-20 **SACRISTAN (WEEKEND)** Responsible for overseeing preparation prior to weekend Liturgies.
- 1-21 **SERVERS** Volunteers would help schedule, train and wash vestments.

## ADMINISTRATION

- 2-1 **ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE** Pastor appointed.
- 2-2 **BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS** Responsible for care, repair, and upkeep of church, rectory, and all buildings and grounds.
- 2-3 **COMMUNITY CENTER** Pastor appointed.
- 2-4 **FINANCE** Pastor appointed.
- 2-5 **MONEY COUNTERS** Pastor appointed.
- 2-6 **STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE** Pastor appointed.
- 2-7 **TELEPHONE COMMITTEE** Responsible for assisting the Stewardship Committee in follow-up phone calls to give reminders that forms need to be turned in and to help parishioners complete their time, talent and treasure forms, if necessary.

## FORMATION

- 3-1 **ADULT FORMATION** Adult education opportunities offer parishioners new insight, learning, and spiritual growth in faith. Programs such as Bible studies, topic nights, parent sessions, etc. help the members of the community grow in the Catholic faith as well as develop a community atmosphere. Seasonal programs could take place during Advent, Lent, Summer, etc.
- 3-2 **BAPTISMAL PREPARATION** To assist parents in understanding the sacrament of Baptism – its origins, signs, symbols and responsibilities. Parental responsibilities and sponsorship are discussed. A two-session meeting is required prior to Baptism.
- 3-3 **COUPLE-TO-COUPLE** This program is for couples that value their marriage and are willing to share their journey and experiences with other engaged couples preparing for marriage. The lead couple meets with the engaged couple for approximately 3-5 meetings and is scheduled for no more than 2 different couples each year. (Must be married five years or longer. Must attend Archdiocesan training program.)
- 3-4 **FAITH CLUB** Provides an opportunity for developmentally handicapped adults to spend time together with like members of regional parishes to study Scripture and to socialize.
- 3-5 **LITURGY OF THE WORD FOR CHILDREN** Takes place during the 9:00 Liturgy on Sundays – Proclaimers and leaders assist on a monthly basis to help children understand the meaning of the Word.
- 3-6 **RCIA** is a process for adults wishing to be Baptized or Confirmed in the Catholic faith. Meetings are held weekly from September to May and offer the opportunity for adults to receive instruction in Catholic beliefs as well as the opportunity to meet others willing to share their faith journey. Anyone interested in learning more about the Catholic way of life is welcome; as well as any Catholic willing to share time in prayer as part of the RCIA team.
- 3-7 **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION** Catechists and substitute catechists for grades 1-8 provide religious instruction and sacramental preparation to elementary and middle school children not enrolled in a parochial school.
- 3-8 **SPX TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE** This committee provides computer support to the parish office.
- 3-9 **VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL** Provides Bible education in a fun format of instruction, music, crafts, storytelling, and games for 4-year olds through 5<sup>th</sup> grade. Volunteers are needed to teach, assist teachers, crafts, etc.
- 3-10 **YOUTH MINISTRIES (HIGH SCHOOL—HSTG)** Reaches out to young people by integrating them into the life, work & mission of the Church through programs that offer spiritual growth, as well as social, educational and service opportunities. Volunteers would help with driving and chaperoning special events.
- 3-11 **YOUTH MINISTRIES (JUNIOR HIGH—JHYG)** To introduce middle school-age parishioners to the life, work & mission of the Church through fun activities. Youth ministries also provide programs that offer spiritual growth, as well as social, educational, and service opportunities. Volunteers would help with driving and chaperoning special events.

## PARISH LIFE

- 4-1 **BBAMP DIVORCED AND SEPARATED GROUP** Support and social activities for separated and divorced adults.
- 4-2 **BBAMP MOTHERS GROUP** A social, educational, spiritual gathering for mothers with small children. Wednesday meetings are times shared with children. Tuesday meetings have babysitting provided while mothers meet and share their ministry of motherhood. Seniors of BBAMP parishes volunteer for baby sitting duties.
- 4-3 **BOY SCOUTS** Active adults teach leadership, citizenship, and self-confidence through participation in fun and challenging activities.
- 4-4 **DIALOGUE** In-house publication to inspire and inform all parish members.
- 4-5 **FISH FRY** Volunteers are responsible for making sure the food is prepared and served at all fish fries.
- 4-6 **GIRL SCOUTS** Organizes parent participation to teach and instill a sense of belonging and accomplishment.
- 4-7 **GOLDEN YEARS** Senior citizens that meet once a month for a short meeting, play cards and visit over a brown bag lunch.
- 4-8 **ON WITH LIFE** A support group for recently widowed persons.
- 4-9 **PARISH CELEBRATIONS** This group helps organize and prepare for large parish celebrations.
- 4-10 **PICNIC COMMITTEE** This group is responsible for coordinating all activities for the 2-day summer picnic in June. Approximately 10 people schedule vendor purchases, deliveries, coordinate dinners, organize booth workers, schedule set-up/clean-up of the grounds.
- 4-11 **PICNIC VOLUNTEERS** This total parish event requires hundreds of volunteers for its success. Picnic volunteers can set up booths, work in booths, serve dinners, clean up grounds, and take down booths.
- 4-12 **SENIOR ACTIVITY TEAM** Help plan, coordinate, and assist on senior day trips.

- 4-13 **SPX BOOSTER CLUB (BOARD)** Supports sports activities through the year for St. Pius X adults.
- 4-14 **SPX BOOSTER CLUB (BOARD SUPPORT)** This group will assist the Booster Board members with various duties such as maintaining the fields, equipment, etc.
- 4-15 **SPX BOOSTER CLUB (CONCESSIONS)** Help sell concessions during CSAA sporting events held here at St. Pius X.
- 4-16 **TRANSPORTATION NETWORK** Anyone interested in transporting parishioners to church functions (because of a difficulty with driving) such as Mass, meetings, parish celebrations, etc.
- 4-17 **WELCOMING COMMITTEE AND MENTORING** Volunteers host welcoming receptions and serve as mentors.
- 4-18 **YOUNG ADULT MINISTRY** Social and faith-based activities for young adults 18-35.

### SOCIAL CONCERNS

- 5-1 **BBAMP HABITAT FOR HUMANITY** Help build homes; or provide and serve lunches for workers; or help with administrative functions and social services.
- 5-2 **CLOUT (Citizens of Louisville Organized and United Together)** Bring 3 people with you to the Action Assembly in March and attend 2 other meetings.
- 5-3 **COMMODITIES FOR THE POOR** Bring food, personal hygiene and household items to be distributed by Sister Visitor and SEAM.
- 5-4 **COMMUNICATIONS/PUBLICITY** Promote Social Concerns activities by writing announcements and articles, making posters, phone calls and other communications.
- 5-5 **ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS** Promote awareness and understanding and seek solutions for environmental problems.
- 5-6 **HELPING HAND KITCHEN** Help serve the evening meal the first Wednesday of the month at 4:45pm.
- 5-7 **LEGISLATIVE ADVOCACY NETWORK** Receive alerts concerning upcoming legislation and take appropriate action.
- 5-8 **MONTHLY THEME COLLECTION** Donate items monthly as specified in the bulletin. Items are collected in the green bins and are distributed to St. John's Center, Sister Visitor, Home of the Innocents, Wayside Christian Mission, etc.
- 5-9 **OPERATION RICE BOWL** Distribute and collect Lenten Rice Bowls and promote participation with announcements, displays and activities.
- 5-10 **RESPECT LIFE** Promote respect for human life by addressing issues concerning mental and physical disabilities, euthanasia, AIDS, abortion, capital punishment, and abuse.
- 5-11 **SEAM VOLUNTEERS** Help in the assistance center weekly from 10am-12:30pm; after school tutoring; senior nutrition program and fundraising activities like "Taste of the Town".
- 5-12 **SHARING AND CARING TREE** Organize the needs of several families, make tags, collect and sort donated gifts, purchase gifts with donated money and distribute to families.
- 5-13 **THANKSGIVING BASKETS** Collect food and deliver to SEAM prior to Thanksgiving.
- 5-14 **WAYSIDE CHRISTIAN MISSION PRAYER SERVICE** Provide food and drink or help prepare prayer service or visit shelter residents for shared prayer and hospitality on the first Sunday of each month at 6pm.

### JOHN PAUL II ACADEMY

- 6-1 **CHEERLEADERS** Adult volunteers will organize and coach cheerleaders, grades 4-8.
- 6-2 **CUB SCOUTS** Organizes parent participation to teach and instill a sense of belonging and accomplishment.
- 6-3 **JPIIA BOOSTER CLUB (BOARD)** Supports sports activities through the year for youth through coaching, etc.
- 6-4 **PTO (PARENT TEACHER ORGANIZATION) (BOARD)** Mission to promote understanding and communication between home and school. Provides educational programs for adults, KLEA representation, fund raising, and volunteers for school.
- 6-5 **PTO (APPRECIATION)** To assist with student, staff and parent appreciation events and meet other hospitality needs.
- 6-6 **PTO (FUNDRAISING)** To assist with major fundraising events and ongoing fundraising efforts.
- 6-7 **PTO (HEALTH)** Promotes health programs offered through school—hearing tests, eye tests, etc.
- 6-8 **PTO (MARKET DAY)** Volunteers would be responsible for set-up/clean-up and assisting shoppers on a monthly basis.
- 6-9 **PTO (ROOM PARENTS)** Leaders and assistants for each homeroom organize special parties and help at other functions.
- 6-10 **PTO (VOLUNTEERS)** To assist the school with general duties such as shelving library books, typing report cards, Book Bee coaches, Quick Recall, drive students of John Paul II to community service projects, chaperone fields trips, help set-up/clean-up and serve the Sedar Meal, registration packets, help with uniform sales, recycling projects, etc.
- 6-11 **SCHOOL BOARD** Advisory board for school operations. Sets policy and procedures for school administration.
